## LS1 CPSF Home Safety checklist

Please ensure that these precautions are in place to safeguard your family, discuss it with them:

<b>v</b>	<b>Don't delay, be prepared today</b>
	<b>BE a vigilant neighbour! Know your neighbour! They can contact for help when you can't</b>
	<b>Pay attention to info shared on CPF LS1 Zwartkop_Die Hoewes Community group Get involved: JOC, Patroller, Manpower.</b>
	<b>Put valuables in yard out of sight Ensure all valuables are locked away at all times, directly after use</b>
	<b>Ensure dangerous objects that can be used to break windows or burglar bars/doors, like bricks/rocks/garden tools are put away</b>
	<b>Ensure your yard is well lit at night</b>
	<b>Install anti-lift measures for gate</b>
	<b>Install anti-theft measures for gate motor</b>
	<b>Park high end or sought after vehicles in the garage</b>
<b>Set reminder</b>	<b>Monthly: Ensure your cameras and beams are fully functional (batteries replaced regularly for beams and remotes)</b>
<b>Set reminder</b>	<b>Weekly: Check and maintain your electric fence</b>
	<b>Ensure home alarm and electric fence is connected to armed response</b>
	<b>Burglar proofing and security gates on all opening windows and doors</b>
	<b>Alert domestic worker/gardener when you expect a package Don't open the gate for strangers Discuss possible dangers with household members. Who is expected and when, confirm before opening</b>
	<b>Handle quotes personally, don't arrange when you are not home and don't be alone</b>
	<b>Dogs are a good deterrent, big outside with enough shelter and small sleeping inside</b>

	<b>Post reminder</b>	<p><b>Always keep security doors locked</b></p> <p><b>Daily check-up:</b></p> <p><b>* Ensure all household members check all doors and windows are closed when going out or going to sleep.</b></p>
		<p><b>Water Safety:</b></p> <p><b>Ensure swimming pool is properly fenced to protect children and pets</b></p>
	<b>Set reminder</b>	<p><b>Bushes trimmed quarterly to optimise visibility at night</b></p>
		<p><b>Emergency Contact List: Have an list of your emergency contacts in a place where all household members can have easy access to it and make a point of asking them what these numbers are: Eg. LS1 CPSF JOC saved on all phones (0861571911), SAPS (10111), Armed Response, Fire/Gauteng Ambulance: 107 on mobile, Private Ambulance Services.</b></p>
		<p><b>Fire Plan: Ensure your household is equipped with fire extinguishers and that they are serviced annually. Also make sure that your household members know how to use it. Discuss with your household members how a fire in each part of the residence should be handled - escape routes and steps to take when safe. Home Fire Plan checklist to follow.</b></p>
		<p><b>Escape Plan: It is crucial that all are aware of what measures to take in the case of a burglary, natural disaster, or fire. In creating your family's escape plan, the most important thing is to teach your house members the quickest way to get out of the house.</b></p>
		<p><b>Emergency Kit: Flash-light, charged Emergency Phone with airtime &amp; data (Emergency contact list saved), labelled key-set for all house doors, blankets, snack bars, bottled water, first-aid kit.</b></p>
		<p><b>First-aid kit: Ensure this is stocked in accordance with you household members medical requirements, and that members know location. Suggested item list available.</b></p>
